

# Texas Farm Bureau Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher Contest 2016 Rules and Awards

## **BACKGROUND**

The Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) annually conducts an Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher (YF&R) Contest. Selection of the winning YF&R competitor is based on his/her efforts in production agriculture and leadership achievement. Participation in this program with individual recognition and the resulting publicity will help build the individual and the organization. **The ideal candidate(s) for the Outstanding YF&R Award is an individual or couple involved in production agriculture with a majority of his/her income subject to normal production risks.**

Information about the Outstanding YF&R Award applicant is requested on the entry form. All information is handled in strict confidence and is destroyed after judging is completed.

## **PRIZES AND AWARDS**

### **ALL APPLICANTS**

1. \$100 service voucher (sponsored by Chevrolet Certified Service).

### **THREE FINALISTS**

1. Expense paid trip for finalist and spouse to annual meeting in San Antonio, December 2016 where state winner announced.

### **TWO FINALISTS**

1. Pair of Justin boots (sponsored by Justin Brands, Inc.).
2. Power tool (sponsored by Grainger).
3. \$500 cash (sponsored by Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company).

### **STATE WINNER**

1. Chevrolet ¾ ton diesel, 4-door, 4-wheel drive Silverado pickup (sponsored by Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies).
2. One year use of a Case IH Farmall series tractor (Sponsored by Case IH).
3. \$5,000 cash (sponsored by Farm Credit).
4. \$750 service voucher (sponsored by Chevrolet Certified Service).
5. Expense paid trip for the state winner and spouse to compete in the American Farm Bureau Federation Achievement Award during the 2017 AFBF Convention in Phoenix, AZ (provided by Texas Farm Bureau).

### **AFBF NATIONAL Awards**

Winner receives - Choice of either a 2017 Chevrolet Silverado or 2017 GMC Sierra, paid registration to the AFBF FUSION Conference in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania on Feb.10-13, 2017. Winner and two Finalists receive - a Case IH Farmall 50A, \$2,500 cash prize and \$500 in STIHL merchandise.

## **ELIGIBILITY**

- An applicant can be either an individual or a couple that is married and a current member to the Texas Farm Bureau. Married applicants will apply as a couple if both spouses meet all other eligibility requirements.
- Applicant(s) shall be Texas Farm Bureau member(s) between the ages of 18 and 35 in good standing with his/her county Farm Bureau. The individual or spouse shall have reached his/her 18<sup>th</sup> birthday at the time he/she qualifies for the national competition and shall not have reached his/her 36<sup>th</sup> birthday by Jan. 31, 2017.
- Applicant(s) must be actively engaged in farming and/or ranching, with the majority of his/her income coming from production agriculture.
- Applicant(s) may compete in the Excellence in Agriculture or the Outstanding YF&R, but not both.
- Past and present members of the AFBF Young Farmers & Ranchers Committee and/or their spouse are not eligible to compete.
- Past state Outstanding YF&R Award winners are not eligible to compete.
- Current employees of county, state and/or American Farm Bureaus and their affiliates are not eligible to compete.
- Each applicant must use the Texas Farm Bureau entry form and application.
- There is no limit on the number of entries from each county.

## **ENTRY FORM & APPLICATION GUIDELINES**

- Do not use applicant's name, the name of his/her city or county, or any names that may bring about the recognition or identification of the applicant beyond the entry form.
- The entry form and application must be completed in first person narrative (i.e. I, me, we, etc.) for questions I-VI. Applicants must use "A1" and "A2" to denote each applicant for all of question VII.
- Do not use abbreviations or acronyms.
- Do not bind or restructure this application. (Leave the application as is)

**Note: Disregarding any of the guidelines listed above will result in disqualification.**

## **JUDGING**

- The entry form and application of each entry will be coded upon receipt by TFB. The applicant's name and county will not be revealed to the judges until judging is completed.
- Values used in judging at all levels will be:

Farm Operation and Growth:	70 points
How Operation was Acquired:	60 points
Farm Bureau Leadership:	40 points
Other Leadership:	30 points (Agriculture = 15 points, Community = 10 points, Goals = 5 points)
<b>Total:</b>	<b>200 points</b>

## **DISTRICT LEVEL JUDGING**

- A panel of three qualified judges will select each District winner. The District winners will be judged by an additional panel of three qualified judges who will review the written applications and determine the three finalists.

## **THREE FINALISTS JUDGING**

- An additional panel of three qualified judges will review the applications and visit the top 3 finalists on their farm and/or ranch. From this process the overall winner will be determined.
- The on farm/ranch interviews will be up to 3 hours in length.
- During the visit/interview process, only the named applicant(s) on the entry form are permitted.

## **PHOTOGRAPHS**

Applicant may provide pictures of the operation. Pictures should be mounted in some way that will keep them in order and will facilitate copying on a machine. It is important that you explain what each picture is. Mounting on a sheet of heavy paper with a caption under each picture or simply scanned and copied on plain paper is desirable. **Do not send in loose individual pictures with captions written on the back. Picture should not identify the applicant, or his/her city or county.**
