2019 Texas Farm Bureau Leadership Conference: Grassroots Advocacy Focuses on Eminent Domain

More than 400 Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) members traveled to Austin this week for the Leadership Conference. These members visited with legislators from across the state to advocate for eminent domain reform. As reported in last week's newsletter, SB 421 and HB 991 were filed last week. And TFB members were asked to contact their legislators to ask them to co-author these bills as a sign of support. This week, our members followed-up personally on this request.
