Texas Farm Bureau Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher Contest 2019 Rules and Awards

BACKGROUND

Texas Farm Bureau (TFB) annually conducts an Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher (YF&R) Contest. Selection of the winning Outstanding YF&R competitor is based on his/her efforts in production agriculture and leadership achievement. Participation in this program with individual recognition and the resulting publicity will help build the individual and the organization. The ideal candidate(s) for the Outstanding YF&R Award is an individual or couple involved in production agriculture with a majority of his/her income subject to normal production risks. *All information is handled in strict confidence*.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

THREE FINALISTS

1. Expense paid trip for finalist and spouse to the Texas Farm Bureau Annual Meeting in San Antonio, TX, December 2019 where state winners are announced.

TWO FINALISTS

1. \$500 cash (sponsored by Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company).

STATE WINNER

- 1. ¾ ton diesel, 4-door, 4-wheel drive pickup (sponsored by Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Companies).
- 2. \$5,000 cash (sponsored by Farm Credit).
- 3. Expense paid trip for the state winner and spouse to compete in the American Farm Bureau Federation Achievement Award during the 2020 AFBF Convention in Austin, TX (provided by Texas Farm Bureau).

AFBF NATIONAL AWARDS

Prizes for the AFBF Achievement Award winner were unavailable at the time of publication.

ELIGIBILITY

- An applicant can be either an individual or a couple that is married and a current member of Texas Farm Bureau. Married applicants will apply as a couple if both spouses meet all other eligibility requirements.
- Applicant(s) shall be Texas Farm Bureau member(s) between the ages of 18 and 35 in good standing with his/her county Farm Bureau. The individual or spouse shall have reached his/her 18th birthday at the time he/she qualifies for the national competition and shall not have reached his/her 36th birthday by Jan. 31, 2020.
- Applicant(s) must be actively engaged in farming and/or ranching, with the majority of his/her income coming from production agriculture.
- Applicant(s) may compete in the Excellence in Agriculture or the Outstanding YF&R, but not both.
- Each applicant must use the Texas Farm Bureau online form and application located: https://my.texasfarmbureau.org/.
- There is no limit on the number of entries from each county.
- Past and present members of the AFBF Young Farmer & Rancher Committee and/or their spouse are not eligible to compete.
- Past state Outstanding YF&R Award winners are not eligible to compete.
- Current employees of county, state and/or American Farm Bureau and their affiliates are not eligible to compete.

ENTRY FORM & APPLICATION GUIDELINES

- Application must not contain any information that would identify the applicant(s) including,
 applicant(s) name, the name of his/her city or county, schools or any names that may bring about
 the recognition or identification of the applicant beyond the biographical information.
- The entry form and application must be completed in first person narrative (i.e. I, me, we, etc.) for questions I-VI. Applicants must use A1 and A2 to denote each applicant.
- Abbreviations/Acronyms may only be used if the spelled out form of the word(s) are used in the first instance, with abbreviations/acronyms listed following in parenthesis, and then use the abbreviation/acronym only, for later reference in the application.

EXP: United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)

JUDGING PROCESS

The entry form and application of each entry will be coded upon receipt by Texas Farm Bureau. The applicant's name and county will not be revealed to the judges until judging is completed. Values used in judging at all levels will be:

Farm Operation and Growth: 70 points
 How Operation Acquired: 60 points
 Farm Bureau Leadership: 40 points

- Other Leadership: 30 points (AGRICULTURE = 15 POINTS, COMMUNITY = 10 POINTS, GOALS = 5 POINTS)

Total: 200 points

DISTRICT LEVEL JUDGING

 A panel of three qualified judges will select each District winner. The District winners will be judged by an additional panel of three qualified judges who will review the written applications and determine the three finalists.

FINAL ROUND JUDGING (Three Finalists)

- An additional panel of three qualified judges will review the applications and visit the top 3 finalists on their farm and/or ranch. From this process, the overall winner will be determined.
- The on-farm/ranch interviews will be up to 3 hours in length.
- During the visit/interview process, only the named applicant(s) on the entry form are permitted.

PHOTOGRAPHS

- Applicant may provide up to four (4) pictures of the operation, and one (1) family photo. The 4 operation pictures should not identify the applicant, or his/her city or county.
- Pictures will need to be 1200 pixels wide x 1600 pixels tall (4" X 6", 300 dpi) in jpg file format.

DEADLINE

 Online application must be submitted by selecting the green "submit and finish" button on the online application no later than June 15, 2019. Once the application has been submitted you cannot edit your application.

NOTE: Disregarding any of the guidelines listed above will result in disqualification.
