# **Legislative Update**

#### **Eminent Domain**

**HB 901** and **HB 2730:** Relating to the acquisition of real property by an entity with eminent domain authority.

Rep. Deshotel, Joe (R)

Representative Burns & Chairman Deshotel have solicited input and bill language from stakeholders since the committee hearing on HB 901 and HB 2730 last week.

Texas Farm Bureau has continued to work with both offices in providing input on the language provided to both bill authors. We are working to ensure that whichever bill passed by the committee includes the provisions necessary to help landowners negotiate a fair deal for their property.

At this time, Chairman Deshotel's goal is to vote on the bill at the regular hearing of the committee on April 20. However, this could change depending on many factors, including the support or opposition of stakeholders.

Either bill needs to be passed by the committee before the end of April to have the best chance of passing the House.

#### Water

**SB 152:** and **HB 668:** Relating to the regulation of groundwater conservation districts.

HB 5 and SB 5: Relating to the expansion of broadband services to certain areas.

**Passed by Senate, on to House:** On Wednesday, March 31, SB 5 was passed to the third reading by the Texas Senate with 31 votes for and 0 votes against. The Senate adopted one amendment to adjust the due date of the development map publication by three months.

**HB 365:** Relating to the limitation of liability for farm animal activities. Rep. Murr, Andrew (R)

**Passed by House, on to Senate:** On Wednesday, March 31, HB 365 was passed to the third reading by the Texas House with 147 *for* and 0 *against*. The House adopted one amendment to include beekeeping.

On Thursday, April 1, HB 365 was passed out of the House with 147 votes for and 0 votes against. It was received by the Senate on Monday, April 6.
