

**Collegiate Scholarship Requirements Checklist  
S.M. True, Jr. Agricultural Scholar Award**

**\*Scholarships must be submitted on-line on or before 11:59 PM, March 1, 2024\***

**One scholarship will be awarded, valued at \$20,000**

- **This scholarship will be awarded in four disbursements, payable to your college or university**
- **Scholarship recipients will be announced by the end of May 2024**

**Eligibility requirements:**

- Applicant must complete all questions
- Must be a member of Farm Bureau family with continuous membership for at least 3 years at the time of application (*membership must remain in good standing for the duration of the scholarship*)
- Must be enrolled, or about to enroll, in an agriculture program major, provide a copy of course work and grades, to date, of application
- Must be enrolled in a four-year college or university
- Must have a minimum of 60 credit hours and/or a junior classification upon receipt of the 1<sup>st</sup> payment in the fall of 2024
- Must be an undergraduate
- Must have a GPA of at least 2.5
- Must intend to pursue a career in agriculture
- List Collegiate / University information
- Other scholarships (submitted or received) / financial assistance
- List percentage of income paying for your education
- List major agriculture leadership activities & honors
- List other leadership activities & honors
- Applicant must upload a copy of the applicant's college transcript
- Applicant must upload the FSS (FAFSA Submission Summary) if the FAFSA was submitted
- Applicant must upload an approved degree plan
- Must upload two letters of recommendation
  - a. From the county Farm Bureau president of the applicant's membership county, and
  - b. From the dean or head of the agriculture program department of the applicant's college or university
- Please upload a portrait of yourself

**\*\* Please note** – to receive the total award of \$20,000 payable in \$5,000 increments for each semester of the scholar's junior and senior year, applicants are encouraged to apply the semester prior to their junior year.
