COUNTY ACTIVITES OF EXCELLENCE AWARDS PROGRAM

The County Activities of Excellence awards recognize unique, volunteer-driven programming at the local level. Five counties were recognized by Texas Farm Bureau and American Farm Bureau Federation for innovative, action-oriented programs.

Visit the displays in the exhibit area to learn more about the activities. Each of these counties will receive cash awards.

Angelina County Farm Bureau

Angelina County Farm Bureau treated elementary and primary school educators to a teacher appreciation event and highlighted free resources available to them through the Ag in the Classroom program.

Austin/Washington County Farm Bureaus

Local farmers, ranchers and landowners learned more about methods to control feral hogs at a meeting hosted by Austin and Washington County Farm Bureaus.

Mason County Farm Bureau

Elementary students experienced agriculture up close at Mason County Farm Bureau's annual Ag Day. The event included live animals, demonstrations and hands-on activities.

Titus County Farm Bureau

Titus County Farm Bureau brought agriculture to life in the classroom one page at a time by reading accurate ag books to students through Farm To Classroom Storytime.

2024 OUTSTANDING YOUNG FARMER & RANCHER TOP 3

The Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher contest is designed to identify, recognize and reward exceptional young farmers and ranchers from across the state. This contest gives young farmers and ranchers an opportunity to highlight the growth and development of their agricultural operations.



Kade and Morgan Hodges

Kade and Morgan Hodges have a diverse ranch in Sterling County. They raise Royal White sheep, cattle and goats, as well as operate a feedyard. The couple offer vegetation management to solar farms using targeted sheep grazing.



Colby and Ashley McClendon

Colby and Ashley McClendon grow corn, oats, wheat, sorghum, soybeans and hay. They are the sixth generation to operate the family farm in Collin County. The couple also raise cattle and sell their beef through their meat market located on their farm.



Layton and Jessi Schur

Layton and Jessi Schur have a direct-to-consumer retail store in Hale County, providing their community with fresh produce and beef from their farm and market garden. They also grow grain sorghum and cotton.

2024 OUTSTANDING YOUNG FARMER & RANCHER FINALISTS

The finalists below round out the Top 8 Outstanding Young Farmer & Rancher Finalists. They were selected from across all 13 Texas Farm Bureau districts.

Zach and Savannah Hutka

Zach and Savannah Hutka grow corn, cotton, grain sorghum and wheat in Milam County. They use sustainable practices to maintain soil health and optimize yields, while integrating technology with traditional methods.

Ashton Logsdon

Ashton Logsdon has a beef cattle backgrounding operation, which grows cattle to heavier weights before entering a feedlot, in Shelby County. His operation raises 350 head each year and has room for expansion.

Dillon and Kori Berglund

Dillion and Kori Berglund grow rice, corn, soybeans, grain sorghum and hay in Wharton and Matagorda counties. The couple has implemented sustainable practices on their farm for the most efficient water usage. They also raise beef cattle.

Caroline Krenek

Caroline Krenek is a fourth-generation farmer who grows corn and cotton in Wharton County. She utilizes precision technology, such as drones, to maximize production on her farm. She also helps with her family's turfgrass farm.

Zachary and Rheegan Mengers

Zachary and Rheegan Mengers are fifth-generation farmers in Bee County. They grow corn, cotton and grain sorghum. Zachary also helps his family raise and market American Wagyu cattle directly to consumers.

2024 EXCELLENCE IN AGRICULTURE TOP 3

The Excellence in Agriculture contest recognizes young men and women ages 18-35 who are involved in agriculture but do not earn a majority of their income from an owned farm or ranch enterprise in the past three years.



Jacob and Laura Henson

Jacob and Laura Henson own a marketing agency and help operate Laura's family's white-tailed deer ranch and silage harvesting business. They also grow and sell vegetables. Laura is an adjunct instructor at Tarleton State University, and Jacob owns a construction company.



Madalynn Kainer

Madalynn Kainer is the assistant manager for the Washington County Fair. She oversees livestock shows, auctions and marketing while supporting all fair activities, including event planning and volunteer management.



Jacob Spivey

Jacob Spivey is an ag science teacher and FFA advisor at Warren ISD. He works with students on livestock and horticultural projects, leadership skills and FFA contests. He also helps with his family's Brahman cattle and timber operation.

2024 EXCELLENCE IN AGRICULTURE FINALISTS

The finalists below round out the Top 8 Excellence in Agriculture Finalists. They were selected from across all 13 Texas Farm Bureau districts.

Chase Brooke

Chase Brooke is the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Program Specialist for Small Acreage and Wildlife Management. In his role, he develops and implements programs for small acreage landowners on brush control and property management.

Charles Davis

Charles Davis is the Agriculture and Natural Resources County AgriLife Extension agent in Rusk County. In this position, he provides education and research-based information to local farmers, ranchers and landowners.

Fred and Claire Hilscher

Fred Hilscher is the nutrition team lead for a company that provides feed and nutritional consulting services to livestock producers, and Claire works for a beef supply chain company that owns and grows cattle for retail.

John Holland

John Holland has been an agricultural science teacher and FFA advisor for 12 years. He currently teaches at Sulphur Springs High School. He and his wife, Andrea, also raise cattle and market some of their beef direct to consumers.

Ryan and Madilyn Yeatts

Ryan Yeatts is an operations analyst for Standard Meat Company. Madilyn is a sales specialist with D&L Farm and Home. The couple both grew up in farming and ranching families and raise sheep and cattle together in Montague County.
