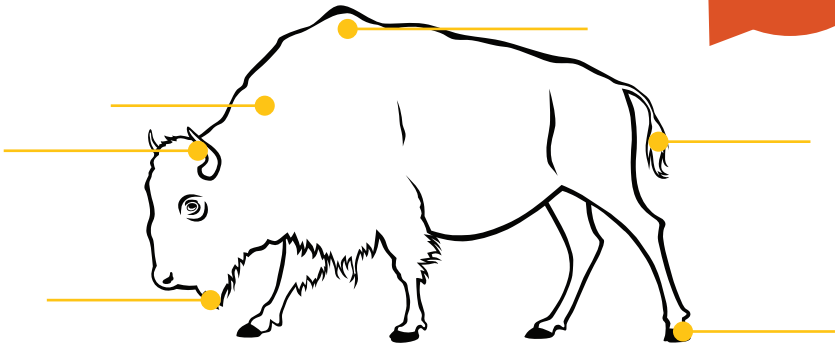

Winter: Bison use their horns a lot in the winter to move the snow so they can eat.

Spring: Bison begin to molt (shed) their winter coat as temperatures rise. Babies are born in the spring.

Summer: Bison wallow (roll around) a lot in the summer to get rid of bugs on their backs.

Fall: Bison begin to grow more hair so they stay warm in the winter months ahead.
