WHAT IS TURF GRASS?



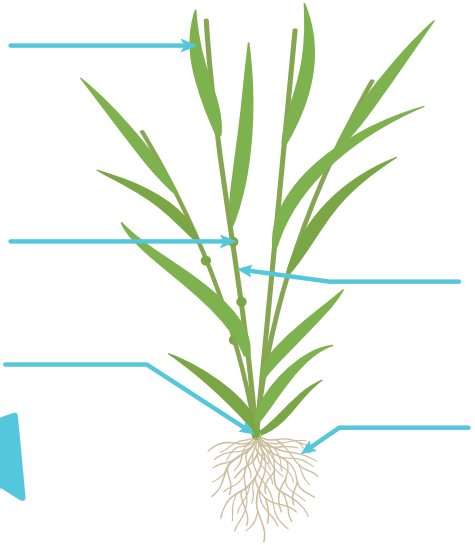
Turf grass is the type of grass that grows in lawns, parks, golf courses and sports fields. These areas are places where a **strong** grass is needed.
