Brian Bledsoe

Brian Bledsoe is the founder and Chief Meteorologist/Climatologist for Brian Bledsoe Weather. His private weather consulting business has been serving farmers, ranchers, and many other businesses for the past 25 years. Recently retired from television, many of you may also know Brian from having

been a broadcast meteorologist for the past 28 years. Brian's goal is to help farmers and ranchers make their business more successful by equipping them with actionable forecast information, both short term and long term. His strong background in agriculture is important, as he can directly relate to the producer and their specific needs. Brian has several clients in the Great Plains as well as the whole United States. He is regularly featured by many media outlets, speaks at many agriculture conferences, and is constantly advocating for farmers and ranchers.



Ryan Yeatts

Ryan Yeatts is a seventh-generation Texan, and his family has been farming and ranching for over 100 years. Ryan earned a bachelor's degree in animal science with a minor in agricultural economics and certificate of meat science from Texas A&M University, as well as a master's degree in meat recipient of the Pachel Hamilton Most Judging Award Ho

science. He is a recipient of the Rachel Hamilton Meat Judging Award. He continues to stay involved in agriculture and works as an operations and business analyst at Standard Meat Company.



Markie Hageman Jones

Markie Hageman Jones is a first generation, beginner cattle producer in California's Central Valley. She grew up riding horses but was disconnected from how her food got to her plate, until the past decade, when she started questioning the media's depiction of the animal agriculture industry. This led

her to becoming an advocate for transparency in food production, with a special interest in how beef is produced. Since 2017, she has advocated through her "Girls Eat Beef Too" platform on Instagram and Facebook, as well as her personal pages. From being recognized as NCBA's Master of Beef Advocacy "Advocate of the Year" in 2022, to being part of multiple beef leadership programs, featured on many podcasts, and speaking to audiences across the nation, she hopes to bring more light to beginners in the agriculture industry.

While raising her two children and working as an agricultural appraiser, she and her husband started a direct- to-consumer beef business and she enjoys sharing her journey as a cattlewoman on social media.



John Sachse As a Christian husband, father, 4th generation rancher, men's mindset coach, endurance athlete, and officer in the Kansas Army National Guard, John has seen firsthand the negative effects of stress in our lives. With his coaching

business, RanchFIT, John works with individuals to create a game plan to manage stress and align their lives with their purpose. By providing tools and fostering a community of like-minded individuals, John helps people achieve the things they want in life while overcoming the mountains they face.

In addition, John annually hosts a 5K & 10K ruck at his family's cattle operation in Kansas, where individuals can work on becoming the version of themselves they were called to be by pushing through something that's physically demanding.



John Locke

John Locke, a sixth-generation rancher at JD Hudgins Inc. on the Texas Gulf Coast, grew up immersed in a Registered Brahman seedstock operation with a global reach. After graduating from Texas Tech in 2001, he returned home expecting "business as usual." However, a historic drought

and a major family succession reshaped his perspective. Starting over with half the herd on a quarter of the land forced Locke to rethink traditional practices. Attending the Ranching for Profit School and joining Executive Link helped him transform his approach, focusing on principles like ultra-high-density grazing, aligning business purpose with personal values, and balancing ecology, livestock, profit, and quality of life. Today, Locke works alongside his father, Coleman, managing their division while teaching Ranching for Profit courses, facilitating Executive Link meetings, and consulting across the U.S. Despite his busy schedule, he prioritizes family life with his wife, Salina, and their three daughters. Locke's mission is to make ranching both rewarding and sustainable, building a legacy beyond physical assets.



Maegan Meredith

Maegan is the Director of Leadership and Organizational Training for AFBF. She provides internal consulting and training services for Farm Bureau organizational development and develops strategies for strong programs. Maegan grew up in Polk City, Florida where her family has a small cow-calf and
